



**Office of the State Superintendent of Education Announces
Eligible Local Education Authorities (LEAs) and
Schools in the Community Eligibility Provision
School Year 2015-2016**

Attached is a list of the Local Education Authorities (LEAs) and their school sites in the District of Columbia that are eligible to participate in the Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) under the National School Lunch Program (NSLP) and School Breakfast Program (SBP). These LEAs and schools have an identified student (direct certification, homeless, or foster care) population of 40% or more according to data reported in the District of Columbia's Direct Certification System report, or by the State Agency Homeless Coordinator and/or the Department of Child and Family Services, as of April 1st of this year. Reported this year are also LEAs or schools that have an identified student population of greater than 30% but less than 40%, making them near eligible.

Under CEP, schools are required to offer both breakfast and lunch meals. Eligible schools under this provision will be able to count and claim meals without having to conduct the normal free and reduced price application process. All students will be able to walk through the serving line and receive a free breakfast and lunch without being charged for meals at those schools electing to participate in CEP.

On May 5, 2012, the District of Columbia was awarded the opportunity to participate in the new alternative to the traditional meal application process associated with the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) NSLP and SBP. School year 2013-2014 was the District's second year to offer the provision to eligible schools. This current school year, all schools around the country had the opportunity to take part in this provision to make it easier for eligible children in low income communities to receive free meals for breakfast and lunch.
