Want to Join the Solution?

Join DC Parks and Rec (DPR) and Food Rescue US this summer to help recover perfectly good meals from the DPR Summer Meals program and delivery them to local food pantries.

How Does it Work?

DPR will be partnering with Food Rescue US to use their app to coordinate volunteers to transport food donations to the nearest food pantry. There's no commitment to sign up and once a participant is signed up you can choose which food transportation job you want to help with each week.
