Conference

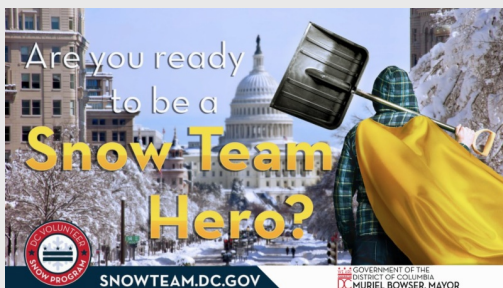

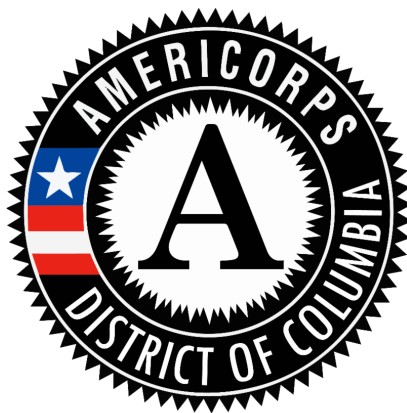
